




- \* If instructors provide a test that is primarily created using Multiple choice questions on a 'Microsoft Word document', the Print Shop at IRSC will format your 'Word' document into the correct format for Respondus.
- \* This presentation will review the process of creating/importing questions to Respondus and uploading the file to Blackboard (LMS).


- \* Before beginning, Select File, > and click on 'Preferences > Edit & Publish > to set the 'point value of most exam questions.
- \* Change the point value if most of your test/questions have the same total value, this will automatically place the point value for each question you add to any file.
- \* Point Values can be customized for each test or every question if needed.








- \* Most exams begin with multiple choice questions that can be prepared in a text (.txt) file or a Word (.doc ) file.





\* First, select the format of the document you wish to import.



\* Next, click 'Type of file' and choose format of document to import.



- \* Select 'Browse',  
Navigate to your file.
- \* Select file and click  
Open



- \* 1. Type a name for your new Respondus file, no spaces.
- \* 2. Select 'Preview' and review your new Respondus file. Be sure all the questions are present in the listing below. Notifications will be provided if there are problems with questions and individual formatting
- \* 3. Select 'Finish'.

1. Select the file to Import:

Type of file: Plain Text

File name: Respondus Example.txt

2. Choose where to add the new Questions:

Append the questions to the current document.

Create a new document, name: MAT1033\_Chap1

Type of file to create:  Exam  Survey

Use "stem" plus question number to create title, e.g. "ch01-" stem becomes "ch01-001", "ch01-002", ...

3. Use the Preview button to check for problems: Preview

4. Press the Finish button to complete the process: Finish

A set of questions from which a random selection is presented to students.

\* Ex. 10 questions are grouped by topic in the original test of 40 questions. Setting Block parameters may enable 5 Random questions from #'s 11-20 to appear in a quiz/test of 35 additional items.

**Random Blocks**

A "random block" is a set of questions from which a random selection is presented to students during the exam. For example, you can create a random set containing 10 questions from which 2 will be selected and presented to students during the quiz.

Before creating sets (random blocks) in Respondus, you should have your file organized so that questions being included in a set are grouped together.

For example, if the fifth question in an exam is going to be randomly selected from a set that contains three questions, these three questions should be grouped together at 5, 6, and 7 in the file. See Help for more information.



- \* Right click to Paste the 'blackboard.irsc.edu' url into #2.
- \* Select 'Extract'
- \* In Description, type Blackboard Log-in
- \* Enter your username and password that you use to enter into your IRSC Blackboard courses.
- \* The system needs this info to 'gain access' to upload your test/assessment into the correct course. Respondus will hunt for the BB server, enter your username and password and gain access to your courses, based on information provided.
- \* Next, you will be asked to select which course/folder to place your assessment in your Blackboard course.

**Blackboard Server and Course** ✕

To automatically set the server information for your institution:

1. Open your browser, go to the Blackboard "Login" page where you type in your name & password, copy the "Address" of the page from the browser to the box below.  
(If you type your name & password into a small grey popup window, leave the box blank.)

2. In your browser go to a course you have instructor rights to, then copy the Address into the box below

3. Press Extract


